The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that Cookstown Motor Club Ltd may issue for the event.

2. Championship

The event is the final round of the 2023 Sligo Pallets Border Championship.

3. Eligible Entrants

This event is open to those who hold a suitable Competition Licence issued by the Motorsport UK or Motorsport Ireland and who are fully elected members of Motor Clubs which are affiliated to the following:

- 1. Association of Northern Ireland Car Clubs
- 2. Scottish Association of Car Clubs
- 3. Association of North East & Cumbria Car Clubs
- 4. The Motorsport Commission of Motorsport Ireland

All competitors must produce a valid and current competition licence issued by the Motorsport UK or Motorsport Ireland and a current club membership card and where applicable, an entrant's licence. Cookstown Motor Club membership is available at £10 per person.

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Competitors Briefing:	This will be in the format of any final instructions issued for this event, which will be posted on the digital notice board (Sportity). Competitors will be responsible for insuring both Driver and Navigator are fully aware of the content.
Start Times:	Start times will be posted on the Digital Notice board (Sportity), first car will leave no earlier than 09.00 hrs on Saturday 14 th October 2023.
Special Stages:	The event will consist of 14 special stages with an approximate mileage of 41 miles/ 65kms. These stages will be timed to the second from standing start to flying finish.
Route:	The stages will be run on private tarmac roads but will include a small portion of loose. Special Stages will be defined in the road book provided.
Competition Numbers:	The organisers will supply Competition numbers. Space must be made available for the event sponsors decals, which must be displayed at all times during the event. Cars not displaying event sponsors decals will be excluded.
Route Safety Notes:	Route Safety Notes will be available from Patterson's Pace Notes. The organisers cannot be held responsible for the content or accuracy of subjective route notes supplied by third parties.

<u>6.</u> <u>Classes</u>

The event will be divided into the following Border Championship Classes as per 29.1 of the 2023 Motorsport Ireland Yearbook. All references in these Classes pertain to 2023 Motorsport Ireland Yearbook.

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8. <u>Results</u>

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the event. Protests must be made in accordance with C5.1.2, C5.2.1 and C5.2.2. Queries will only be accepted on the Official Query form and must be forwarded through the Competitor Liaison Officer (CLO) up to and no later than 30 minutes after the posting of provisional results. Official Query forms can be obtained from CLO or in the back of the road book. All protests must be made through the CLO and must be in accordance with the MOTORSPORT UK Yearbook 2023.

9. Log Books, Motor Tax and MOT

Public road sections will be used on this event, all competitors must confirm on their entry that the competition car is road legal and that it complies with the Road Traffic Act within the country of its registration.

10. Scrutiny (Including noise test) and Documentation Signing on

Before being issued with the necessary documents to enable you to start the rally, the following points should be noted.

- 1. The driver is in possession of a current valid road driving licence.
- 2. MOTORSPORT UK Drivers Licence or Co-Drivers Licence, CANNOT be applied for on the day.
- 3. All drivers must complete an on-line declaration that they hold a valid Motorsport UK RS Interclub, or above, Stage Rally Competition Licence or equivalent MI licence and a club membership card.
- 4. All Co-drivers must complete an on-line declaration that they hold a valid Motorsport UK RS Interclub, or above, Stage Rally Competition Licence or equivalent MI licence and a club membership card.
- 5. Any competitor under 18 must ensure that a legal guardian will be in attendance at signing on to countersign the official signing on sheet.
- 6. That a red reflective triangle and Motorsport UK Approved SOS/OK Board is carried in the competing car.
- 7. In car cameras are strictly forbidden.

Any cameras found to be installed will be confiscated and the data erased before being returned at the end of the day. Further penalties may be applied at the Clerks of the Course discretion.

<u>11.</u> Modified MOTORSPORT UK regulations

All other SR's of the Motorsport UK apply as written except for the following which are modified: -

- 1. A maximum lateness of 5 minutes will apply.
- 2. Servicing may only be carried out in specific areas as indicated in the final instructions.
- 3. In the event of a tie, a competitor who has a greater number of faster times will be the winner, failing which the fastest time on the last stage and so on until a result can be obtained.

Competitors are reminded of the following:

The Damage Declaration form must be completed whether a finisher or not. Damage Declarations will be collected on route by Car Accountability or at the finish ramp.

To be classified as a finisher, competitors must cross the finish ramp. All competitors must have their cars available for post event scrutiny, on request.

Top 3 finishers may be required to participate in a post event photoshoot, which will require both competitors and competing cars.

Failure to attend may result in competitor's exclusion from the results.

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<u>12. Stage starts</u>

Stage starts will be by electronic clock and 'traffic lights'.

The starting for special stages will be given by means of "start lights" which will work as follows:

15 seconds RED and AMBER lights will be displayed

10 seconds RED light will go out

5 seconds Amber countdown 5, 4,3,2,1.

START TIME Green light goes ON

5 seconds after the time Green light goes OUT.

In the event of failure of the electronic system the timekeeper will count down aloud 15" - 10" and the last five seconds one by one and then raise a flag or hand.

All special stages will have flying finishes. After crossing the finishing line the competitor will stop at the timekeepers control and have his/her time recorded.

- Sligo Pallets Border Rally Championship: First three registered Drivers in each Class.
- Note: 11R and 11F treated as separate Classes.
- 5 places for Cookstown Motor Club working members.

Competitor Championship Registrations will be checked and verified by the Organisers with the Cookstown Motor Club records, Rallyscore and Border Rally Championship Co-Ordinator and Registrar.

Any Competitor who falsely states that they are registered for any of the above Championships will be placed at the bottom of the Reserve List, should one exist.

Late Entries from Thursday 28th September 00:00 hrs to Wednesday 4th October 23:59 hrs Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis.

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Maximum/Minimum entries

The maximum entry for the meeting is 80. The minimum is 50.

The minimum entry for each class is 5.

Should any of the minimum figures not be reached the organisers have the right to cancel the meeting or amalgamate classes as required.

<u>15.</u> Entries will only be accepted:

- 1. All competing cars must have a ground sheet to service on. No Ground Sheet - No servicing!! PS, do not brush the ground sheet off onto the park surface!
- 2. There is a 10 MPH speed limit for the all vehicles in this area.
- 3. No motorbikes, quads, or any other form of personal motorised transport permitted in the Area. Any competitor deemed to be in excess of this speed or damaging the surface of the service area will be EXCLUDED!

<u>19. Interpretation of regulations</u>

It is not the duty of any Marshal to interpret regulations or any written instructions to a competitor or to explain the meaning and /or effect thereof. It is the responsibility of the competitor to read and understand the regulations and other written instructions.

20. Insurance details

Motorsport UK Organisers Insurance

The Organisers have applied to Bluefin Sport for a Blanket Cover Note under the above scheme. This will provide competitors who need to use the scheme with the Third Party Cover necessary to meet RTA requirements on the Road Sections of the event.

All applicants wishing to use the scheme must be able to comply with all points of the Bluefin Sport Declaration: -

- I do not have the Third Party Road Section extension on my current Motor Insurance.

- I am aged 19 or over.

- I have had no more than 1 fault claim in the last three years

- I have no more than a maximum of 6 conviction points or a licence ban on my UK

driving licence

- I have the appropriate competition licence as well as a UK/EU driving license and if my license is provisional I will be supervised by an adult over 25.

- I have no physical or mental disabilities

- My vehicle is MOT'd, Taxed and Insured for the road

- I have no other material facts to disclose

- Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should

their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25.

If you comply with all points above, no Letter of Acceptance will be required. If unable to comply with any of the above points you will be required to complete the Declaration form (the form can be obtained by contacting the event secretary or Bluefin Sport) which should be forwarded either to the organisers or direct to Bluefin Sport prior to the event to allow sufficient time for a letter of acceptance. to be issued.
